

A NEW APPROACH TO ACTIVATION

Founders Nancy Schier Anzelmo, MSG, and Paula Hertel, MSW, are experts in dementia support programs and older-adult services. They are also lifetime equestrians. They recognize the value of early interventions and believe that supporting people through guided exercises with horses will strengthen primary bonds and activate engagement.

RESEARCH BASED

Connected Horse has collaborated on two research studies with Stanford University and the University of California, Davis to assess impacts of the program. Participants in both studies reported increased feelings of social support, greater self-awareness, reduced anxiety and depression, and improved sleep.



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Connected Horse helps people affected by memory loss and their care partners through therapeutic equine programs.

Over 6.7 million Americans living with dementia and memory loss often struggle with a sense of disconnection. Feelings of loss, apathy, and isolation are common for care partners too. Connected Horse equine-assisted workshops and training inspire connection and engagement and improve the lives of those impacted by dementia and memory loss.

WORKSHOPS

Connected Horse workshops enrich lives and help people feel calmer, more engaged, and connected through guided programs with horses that all take place on the ground (there is no riding). Participants report a greater sense of control and improved relationships. The invaluable workshops are free of charge.

CONNECTED HORSE TRAINING INSTITUTE

The organization brings the therapeutic power of equine connection to people nationally by offering an in-depth training program to barns and training facilities who want to facilitate Connected Horse workshops. The training includes onsite and virtual training, 16 hours of PATH CEU's, supportive educational resources, coaching, evaluation tools, and recertification.
